



- Students at AUC are required to complete at least one community project or internship.
- Students may complete (i) two separate internships, (ii), one CP and one internship, or (iii) a double research internship or (iv) a 30EC internship as part of their studies.
- In the case of two internships, the learning outcomes for the second internship must be different than the ones for the first internship.
- It is also possible to complete two CPs, but only one can count towards the degree requirements.
- It is not possible to do a double CP.



#### **More General Requirements**

- A maximum of 6 credits for projects within AUC, with one exception (double internship).
- Fellow students cannot be CP/I supervisors, with a few exceptions.
- Students are not allowed to complete a CP/I
   project in the summer in which they graduate or in
   their last January intensive period, for February
   starters.





- Students can complete two internships (2x6 ECP).
- That is not a double internship.
- A double internship is always:
  - Research-based
  - 2x168 hours = 336 hours
  - AND it requires writing a second, content-based, report (in addition to the final reflection report)

## **30EC Internship**



- Research-based
- Usually, take place at academic institutions or research institutes
- Must have an academic supervisor
- Students need to submit a Research Proposal before the projects starts which must be approved by the respective Head of Studies.
- 5x168 hours = 840 hours
- AND it requires writing a second, content-based, report (in addition to the final reflection report)
- Please refer to the guidelines for more detailed information.
- Important: you can't go abroad and do a 30EC internship since it counts as an off-campus course (maximum 42 EC according to the AS&Ps).

## **Timing**



- Projects can take place within a single period (autumn, January, spring, June, summer).
- Or can be cross-period projects (can cross over periods within a single semester).
- NO counting back hours (so, if you worked on a project independently last semester, you cannot count it as a CPI).

Register for

- 1. Follow application deadline for the period in which your CP/I starts
- 2. Register for the period your CP/I ends
- 3. Submit report for the period your CP/I ends

#### The process

  - **√** Final Reflection Report
  - **✓** Final Evaluation by your Supervisor

## Special case: Lab internship



- Not easy to organize
- Usually require 3-5 months full time, but flexibility can be negotiated
- Best to plan cross-period during for instance, January-Spring, or June-Summer
- You can let it count as a double internship or two separate internships
- Some of the investment will be extracurricularly, or outside of your 180 EC graduation requirement
- Arrange through teachers from courses



#### **Before Applying**

- Finding an organization.
- What are you interested in? Volunteering, work or professional internship? Or research internship? Abroad or in Amsterdam?
- Start organizing your CP/I at least 4 months before the intended start of the project (application deadlines typically 2 months before start)
- Use your network (family, friends and teachers) to find an organization.

**Timing**: January, June or summer

#### **Checklist for CP/I projects abroad:**

- Travel advice of <u>Dutch Ministry of Foreign Affairs</u>: code orange/red for a country = traveling not allowed
- <u>Insurance</u> (travel, health, repatriation, liability, etc.)
  - > Download the Hienfeld travel assistance app
- Visa/immigration procedures? → make sure you start early with the application process!
- Scholarships/Funding: it might be possible to get Erasmus funding, if
  the project takes place full-time, for a minimum of 2 months, within
  Europe (this would only be applicable to June-summer projects). For
  more information, check the <u>UvA Erasmus programme webpage</u>, or
  contact the AUC International Office (<u>international@auc.nl</u>)

## CP/I projects abroad (2/2)



#### **Checklist for CP/I projects abroad:**

- Determine your finances and make a budget (i.e. additional costs such as housing, visa, train/plane ticket, vaccinations, etc.)
- <u>Subletting your room</u> while abroad for your CP/I project
- Vaccinations
- Arrange housing
- Prescription medicine (check local rules)
- Book a flight/train ticket
- DUO study finance recipients: requesting OV-vergoeding



## **Application and Learning Plan**

- Application submitted via <u>portal</u> according to CP/I guidelines requirements by appropriate deadline.
- Registering (applying for CPI) does not follow regular course registration

- **Spring 2024** 1 December
- June 2024 1 April
- Summer 2024 1 May
